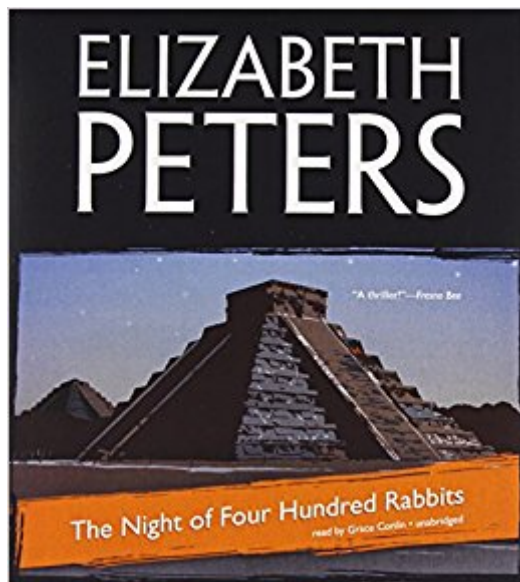

Elizabeth Peters (1927-2013) was a New York Times bestselling author whose novels were often set against historical backdrops. She earned a PhD in Egyptology at the University of Chicago. She also wrote bestselling books under the pseudonym Barbara Michaels. Grace Conlin (1962-1997) was the recording name of Grainne Cassidy, an award-winning actress and acclaimed narrator. She was a member of the Woolly Mammoth Theatre Company in Washington, DC, and won a Helen Hayes Award in 1988 for her role in Woolly Mammoth's production of *Savage in Limbo*.

It's been years since I lost my paperback copy of this book. It seems funny now to be reading it as a historical thriller the way I would read one of her Amelia Peabody stories. However, the story hasn't lost any of its punch. All the issues they projected about drug use plague us today. Carol is a likeable heroine and Tom Andres, the DEA agent is good; I liked him much better than her boyfriend Danny from the start. This is a book well worth re-reading.

I lost a lot of my books recently due to a moisture problem that caused a couple of my books to grow a toxic mold. Since all my books were stored together, I had to discard even the seemingly

unaffected books because of the mold spores. I have been working on restoring my collection, mostly on Kindle. But many of my old favorites are not available on Kindle. This was on the list of books I had tossed so I decided to replace it. I'm glad I got it, but upon re-reading I couldn't believe how dated it was. There are a lot of reviews that go into the inaccuracies of the plot and the inadequacies of Ms. Peter's early writing style, so I won't address those. I will say that it is still Elizabeth Peters and that makes me glad I own it.
