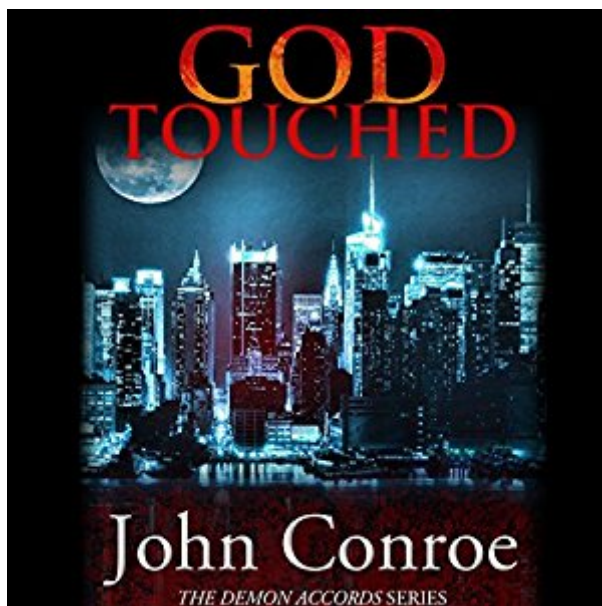

I seldom create reviews so bear with me. I have read all 4 currently released novels in this series. I

give this freshman work 5 stars. It is well worth a read by anyone interested in a good tale.

Especially, but not limited to, the urban fantasy genre. Pros: * The pacing is very good for this novel.

There is a ton of world building that has to happen to introduce you to the protagonist's life. Details

are doled out at a rapid clip and push the story at a fast clip. * Hook - Very quickly you will care about

the protagonist. The story definitely pulls you into his world and has you rooting for him. * Writing - I

enjoyed the writing style. A little humor, and a lot of details. Delves into the "science" of the genre in

an interesting and easy to understand fashion without killing the pacing. * Story - Details come out

fairly regularly and move the story along. The story itself gets pushed to the back a little in this debut

novel as we get to know the characters. Still present and makes sense. * Price - This story is priced

at a debut Author price. Cons: * Minor editing flaws - There are a couple of misspelled words that

should have been caught in editing. "The" instead of "Them". Very minor, easy to catch the meaning and don't detract from the story. Is it possible these are kindle only issues?* Some ideas could have been fleshed out a little more. You won't believe how quickly the novel flies by. Basically it's a very good book. Hard to put down and leaves you wanting more. Luckily there are 3 other novels in the series already released, so you can get your Demon Accord fix. Side notes: If you enjoy authors like Jim Butcher or Patricia Briggs, consider this series required reading. (Not because it adds to those Authors series in any way, instead it is because you will thank me later).

I was instantly hooked! I am now on book 5! There are vampires, demons, werewolves (and werebears, weretigers - even wereweasels!), ancient gods, God and assorted other supernatural. The action is steady and the characters, while a bit shallow and poorly fleshed out, are relatable. If you're a bit of a pedant when it comes to grammar (I am), then these books will often annoy you. Before writing this review (and seeing the author's headshot) I'd have sworn on a stack of Bibles that the author had not yet reached his 25th year (I am 40yo). The grammar plus the lack of depth in the characters, coupled with many plot elements, lead me to that conclusion. I still very much enjoy these (and this, especially!) books (book). He needs a new editor, there are FAR too many mistakes than would be accounted for by copyright infringement traps that we're all used to seeing by now.

Tried it, but not my cup of tea. Don't feel that there is enough here in the novel, and way too much focus on the relationship of the main character with the girl. It presents itself as a story without much depth to me, due to that. I realize the author seems fairly popular...so I would pose a probable conclusion that the style of John Conroe, is simply not to my personal taste. Will say that I felt the overall editing of the novel was well done.

This is the first book in the series and after reading the free Kindle intro it peaked my interest. The story introduces the lead character NYPD Officer Chris Gordon who has the ability to banish demons. He encounters a demon following a woman in a night club and rescues her. Turns out the woman he rescues is Tanya, basically vampire royalty. From there the book introduces a supporting cast that is interesting and the book delves long and hard into the background of Chris and his growing attachment to Tanya. The book has a fair amount of action and the characters are interesting. However, I have several complaints about the book. First, there is a mystery of why the demon wants Tanya. (I don't feel I am giving anything away since this happens starting in the first chapter). Neither Chris nor Tanya figure out the "mystery" instead the evil doer announces himself

and the reason for his evil plan. I really feel that this was a huge lose for the character to grow and a mystery to be solved. Second, Chris is both handsome, ripped, and has two percent body fat. He always thinks women are looking at him with disgust because of his eye color. Really!! The instant fall in love thing between the characters is a bit shallow. However, this is not a pararomance novel as there is no extended descriptions of intimate relations. Overall, I think the book would have been much better if it was a bit longer and strived to cover the few plot holes and flesh in the mystery. The book retained my interest and I am currently reading the second book which I hope will delve into more world building and mystery solving.

We're always looking for more supernatural type books in my family - and we gave this series a shot. My 20 year old son and I (47 year old F) have now purchased & read the entire series, including Black Frost. John Conroe is a good writer (good pacing, character development, correct grammar & spelling which is not always a given when trying out new Kindle books). The characters are simultaneously familiar (werewolves, vampires, witches) and unique so it's a great addition to this genre. I will probably purchase any book John Conroe releases in the future - because they're just fun to read.
