

Synopsis

Raised in Queens, New York by formerly Orthodox Jewish parents whose faith had been undermined by the Holocaust, Arnold Bernstein went on his own personal quest for spiritual meaning. He was ready to accept God in whatever form He chose to reveal Himself and that form turned out to be Christ. But Bernstein soon perceived discrepancies in the various forms of Protestant belief that surrounded him, and so his quest continued -- this time for the true Church. Surprised by Christ combines an engrossing memoir of one man's life in historic times and situations from the Six-Day War to the Civil Rights Movement to the Jesus Movement in Berkeley with an examination of the distinctives of Orthodox theology that make the Orthodox Church the true home not only for Christian Jews, but for all who seek to know God as fully as He may be known.

Father James' curious, interesting and spiritually invigorating account of his personal Odyssey to orthodoxy.But it is not just the story of his road to Christianity and ultimately orthodoxy in as much as his remarkable erudition on the subject of early Christianity and the connection to ancient Judaism which over the course of 2000 years has become obscured to both modern day Jews and contemporary Christians.I recommend this book to anyone interested in understanding the fundamentals of historic and apostolic Christianity.My recommendation does come with a caveat, the latter chapters get very deep into early christian and Judaic dogma and may very easily overwhelm the average reader.

I enjoyed following the life stories of Father Bernstein and how he meandered around, eventually discovering Orthodox Christianity. I enjoyed learning also about the Jewish culture .

An excellent presentation of the Orthodox understanding of the gospel message. As a non-denominational Christian and former Catholic I had great difficulty understanding the Orthodox beliefs until I read this book. The Orthodox teaching has helped me to better understand the new spiritual life we received from Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit. Previously, I had focused more on the atonement and forensic aspects of salvation, not understanding the work that has been done inside those born again.

This is unique story of a journey from the roots of Christianity to the heart of the Orthodox Church. I especially enjoyed the concise and clear explanation of Orthodox theology and its distinctions from other Christian churches. This is a refreshing and hope filled book.

A good book to start out as an introduction to Christian Orthodoxy for the Evangelical Protestant. The author's life experience growing up as a Jew converting to Christianity, the contrast of Evangelical Protestantism and Roman Catholicism to Orthodox Christianity, and how Orthodox Christianity is the fulfillment of Orthodox Judaism provides a good framework for the Western Christian looking into Eastern Christianity. I highly recommend this book as a must read for the inquirer into Christian Orthodoxy.
