

As a mid 20s virgin myself I was hoping to find in this book a more relatable version of hilarious romantic and sexual encounter similar to Chelsea Handler's books (since a big selling point of this book is that McDonald is a writer for Chelsea Lately). What I got was a whiney, sorority girl accounts of all the guys that she dated, thought she was better than or didn't meet her expectations, then broke up with. That would have been okay if she was making fun of her upbringing and realizing how vapid she at the end, was but it wasn't. That would have been okay if the book was actually funny, but it wasn't at all. I got a couple chuckles but that's it. If this review doesn't put you off at less don't

waste the money buying a \$4 used copy (it wasn't even worth that) just check it out at your local library.

Synopsis: Comedienne Heather McDonald, best known for her appearances on the hit TV show *Chelsea Lately*, was a virgin until she was 27 years old. Sure she had lots of boyfriends, was a sorority sister, and went on plenty of dates, but the idealistic California girl was holding out for Mr. Right, while simultaneously holding out on everyone else. McDonald recounts her sexless youth and how she finally "gave it up." Review: I wish I had not read this book and there are two reasons for that. First, because I disliked this book so much, I wanted and still want my money back. This memoir was a waste of words and paper. The reason I feel that way is the second reason I wish I had not read this book: it made me severely dislike Heather McDonald. I used to really enjoy her appearances on the round table on *Chelsea Lately* and I thought she was pretty funny. Having read her book, I now find her nauseating. Throughout her memoir, McDonald makes continual references to her appearance, i.e., how cute she is, how she is too cute to date a certain guy, how a certain guy should be glad someone as cute as she is is dating him, etc. Also, she placed a strange amount of importance on the fact that she was in a sorority in college, and having been in one seemed to continue to affect her present life. Both these things together made McDonald come off as extremely shallow. I did not go into this book with the expectation that McDonald was the deepest, most thought-provoking person in the world. But the excessive shallowness was a complete turn off for me and prevented me from enjoying this book. Instead of being what could have been a pretty funny memoir, the author was so distasteful as a person that the book was ruined. I would not recommend this memoir to anyone.

Being a fan of Chelsea Handler and a fan of her books, I thought I would check it out. I should have read the reviews and saved myself the time I can never get back from reading this book. It was horrible, I'm an easy laugh but I never laughed ONCE. I skipped over page after page trying to get to the end HOPING it would get better. I was BORED and found myself falling asleep more than it keeping my interest. I felt like she was trying too hard to be funny and found herself to be funnier than probably most of the people who read it. Thankfully all I paid was 1 cent for the book. It cost more to ship it to me and the seller was probably more than happy to get rid of it. I won't get back the time I wasted reading it, but at least when I put it in the .25 cent pile at my next garage sale I will have made more off the book than I bought it for.

Many of these stories I heard while listening to the podcast. They are still just as funny, but it is definitely better when hearing Heather tell the story, if you want to "read" this book, I suggest getting the audio version, it'll be funnier.

I feel like a 5th grader wrote this book. The grammar is horrible and there are actually typos (don't editors check things like this before publishing a book??). I'm only halfway through, and to be honest, I'm not sure if I can finish the rest. It's mildly entertaining at times, but if I wasn't also from the Valley and wasn't able to personally identify with many of the places she discusses, I would have definitely given up by now. I love the Chelsea books (minus the last one - wasn't as great, but still a fun and easy read) so I took a chance with this one, figuring Chelsea wouldn't promote anything too awful. Overall, there is no story or point to the book, which can be fine if the little stories were interesting, but they are not.
