

This Loyola Press paperback is the first Vatican-authorized collection of Pope Francis' writings released in the United States. It contains generous excerpts from the speeches and writings of his first year as head of the Catholic Church. Although there are a number of Pope Francis books floating around, mostly from his years before he became pope, this one is among the most inspiring. The topical arrangements are particularly well-chosen and there is a careful editorial hand at work here. This volume is not a cheap rush job -- like many of the books released to the U.S. market in the months after his election -- but a carefully produced volume done by an American Jesuit publishing house for the Jesuit pope. It provides ideal bedside reading and reflection material. I highly recommend it to anyone who is looking for inspiration and a spiritual boost.

It is no wonder that all who are exposed to Pope Francis are captivated by his embracing love and caring nature. These and other attributes are completely accessible in the teachings expressed in this slim volume on Francis' vision for the Church. His language truly touches the heart, mind, and soul. It resonates with the human hunger for spiritual nourishment and growth. Read it with marker in hand. You will wish to go back and remind yourself of what he has shared.

Pope Francis is widely popular with Catholics and non-Catholics alike. However, a book review is a book review and not a popularity contest. That said, the Church of Mercy, on its own merits, deserves four stars. I will explain later why not five stars, but first the positive elements. Without being simplistic, the Church of Mercy takes the readers to the fundamentals of Christianity. The reader is reminded that by emulating the teaching of Christ, caring for the poor, demonstrating compassion, avoiding materialism etc. one leads to a more fulfilling life and the life God wants us to lead. In one chapter, Pope Francis admonishes the clergy to "walk" with congregants. Specifically, to "walk" ahead when needed to show the way, "walk" alongside to be supportive, and to "walk" in back to make sure no one is left behind. While his advice is directed at the clergy, it is an example for lay Christians to follow. This is just one example where, in a new way, Pope Francis explains what the reader already knows about the Christian faith. One of the fundamentals of the Christian faith is that sins are forgiven. The Church of Mercy acknowledges this but does spend a lot of time on the issue. This is good. In our daily life, most of our behavior is neither sinful nor saintly, A church that stresses "we are all sinners" is a church that is unattractive to the vast majority of individuals

who, in the daily lives, are just going about their daily routine, neither saints nor sinners. In the Church of Mercy, Pope Francis reasserts the church's obligation to the poor. He also recognizes that charity includes the dignity and importance of work. Work provides financial stability and decreases the need for charity in the first place. As noted, in places the Church of Mercy Pope Francis is directing clergy how to better priests or bishops. (This reviewer found it enlightening that Pope Francis felt it necessary to remind bishops to promptly return phone calls from priests). However, the general reader is probably not particularly interested in the "CEO" aspects of being a Pope or Cardinal and this weakens the book. Also, the last chapter is the chapter is a very Catholic view on the Virgin Mary. Non-Catholics won't get much out of this chapter. As the final chapter is primarily of interest to Catholics and some of Church of Mercy is directed specifically to the clergy, this reviewer can give it only four stars. Pope Francis, the man, however, gets five.

Up front let me say that I am a lapsed Catholic. Once having touched the religion however I remain curious as to how othershave retained their faith. With this in mind I ordered Pope Francis' book. I was not disappointed. The utter lack of elitism, privilegeis their right from the start. His " who am I to judge" approach showcases this man's Goodness. Have you washed anyone'sfeet lately? I haven't-this Pope has! Throughout the book this man's love and compassion and mercy is openly on display. Moremen like Francis are needed in this world. I am not easily moved by cinematic or political personalities. I have been moved by thisman's writings and heartily recommend that you look into the heart of Pope Francis by reading his book.

It's an easy read, not heavy or complicated. It contains some of his homilies and writings from 2013. One quote I'd like to share: "...with our faith we must create a 'culture of encounter,' a culture of friendship, a culture in which we find brothers and sisters, in which we can also speak with those who think differently, as well as those who hold other beliefs, who do not have the same faith. They all have something in common with us: they are images of God; they are children of God. [We must be] going out to meet everyone, without losing sight of our own position." There are many pearls of wisdom in this book. It has challenged me to do good things with my life. It's definitely directed my focus. I definitely recommend this book. Every Catholic, active or not, should read it!

This book is basically a compilation of various homilies and talks given by Pope Francis during 2013. The thread that is meant to unite the different selections is the theme of mercy. Sometimes that "thread" gets lost in thoughts that are somewhat related to the theme but move away from it. Sometimes a selection is very short and ends without much development. It's an easy read and is user friendly for people who only have snippets of time to devote to spiritual reading while at the same time want something upon which meditate.
