

For me, the very casual reader of "romance" novels, the historical descriptions could have been eliminated. I felt like I really needed to draw out a graph of the feuding families and men. That being said, if I decide to read the entire series, I think I could easily figure it out. This book has many characters and I can see how the relationships and ties need several books to fully comprehend. Tor and Christina. They were the heart of the story I could wrap myself around. I actually loved Tor's rough nature and adored Christina's ability to bring down the walls around Tor's heart. Tor was the ultimate warrior--physically and emotionally, while Christina, the perfect woman for him--demure and innocent looking without fear of standing up to him when needed. Tor, the protector, softened by the love of a woman. The two together lit up the pages with their passion. Seriously intense and Hot! While I haven't decided if I will continue with this era, I will definitely look at this author's other novels for one set in more recent times (even the 1700/1800s feels more comfortable to me), she is obviously extremely talented.

It is the very best in a romance novel, great story, strong characters the reader likes and becomes interested in and passion the can at times set the very pages smoking.
