I view this book as a different fantasy story - related to Norwegian ancient history, but at the same time very up-to-date. I think it is an easy-read for Young People, thrilling, entertaining and easy to relate to, in a way.

For the most part Norse mythology does not make it into the Western curriculum like Greek and Roman. It's nice to find a well-written fantasy based in Norway. I suspect this was originally written in Norwegian as it's a little rough in places like it was difficult to translate, but overall a good job. Interesting story with a good plot and well-developed characters and settings. I hope Kai Mjaanes continues the adventures of Erik, Ida, and Mads. Fun read ideal for middle school age.
