

This story is a beautiful, redemptive one. The memoir tells the story of Anna's experience before and after escaping a polygamist cult. I was particularly intrigued by the narrative of her "voice" in this story. It saddened me to see how insignificant others attempted to make her feel as a young girl. An otherwise exuberant, loving child, she was starved for attention and the affection of her parents. Trauma and tragedy kept her authentic voice trapped and then searching for release. While the reader is seldom privy to LeBaron's inner thoughts and feelings, we are escorted through the

visceral experience of her life as she seeks love, identity and a way to stand up to the very man who silenced her. I found myself cheering at the end, and grateful for each person who becomes a voice for those who have no voice. I highly recommend this book as a gripping read.

In this memoir, Anna LeBaron recounts her childhood living under the oppression of a polygamist cult. As the daughter of the cult leader and one of 50 children, LeBaron shares how growing up in poverty, hunger, and confusion shaped who she was. This redemptive story also explains her escape and the freedom and healing she found later in life. Though a non-fiction memoir, this book reads much like a novel. The voice was reminiscent of the narrator of the novel *Orphan Train*, which was a fictional piece written like a memoir. The transition between young Anna, teen Anna, and adult Anna as narrator is seamless. Scenes from LeBaron's life are painted in riveting detail. I read this book in one sitting; I couldn't put it down. I've already begun researching this cult to piece together more information that happened outside the author's point of view.

I am a huge fan of memoirs and *The Polygamist's Daughter* ranks right up there as one of the best. Anna described the intricate details of her story in such a way as to make me feel that I was right there with her, without triggering any intense moments from my own past. I have always believed in the power of "where a woman who has come through the fire, is brave enough to tell her story, in hopes that someone else who has faced similar circumstances, will feel less alone. Anna does this masterfully. *The Polygamist's daughter* is an honest telling of Anna's journey through heartache and pain, but it doesn't leave you there. She shares the story of the work that Jesus has done in her life, beautifully. She offers hope, no matter what you've been through.

Anna LeBaron has bravely shared her painful, secluded, oftentimes for her, confusing life story, with grace and hope. From the first few lines, you want to rally behind this young child and scoop her out of the horrific scenes that play out before your eyes. You are pulled along with her as she describes "life" or what most would call imprisonment, in a polygamist cult. She is able to give us a picture of what it might feel like to be under constant control with absolutely no voice. The depth of emotion the reader travels through is truly amazing but can in no way compare to what LeBaron describes for herself. The reader is transported along with the author on her own healing journey she took as an adult. Her testimony in this memoir brings to light the atrocities the children of cults can and do endure. Thank Anna LeBaron for having the courage to bring your experience to paper!
